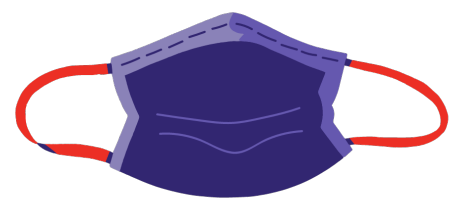
Administration have lifted the mask mandate on public transportation.
